I have carefully read the letter entitled **"Inclusion in the IWUF Registered Testing Pool (RTP) 2015 / ADAMS Whereabouts Information"** and hereby confirm that:

- I understand that I am part of the international Wushu Federation Registered Testing Pool;
- I am aware that I must submit my whereabouts in ADAMS in the manner explained in this document and will be liable for a Filing Failure if I do not comply or if I submit late, inaccurate or incomplete whereabouts information; if I am unavailable for testing due to inaccurate whereabouts information given for a period outside of the 60-minute time slot, this may also constitute a Filing Failure;
- I understand that I will be liable for a Missed Test if I am unavailable for testing during the 60-minute time slot specified in my Whereabouts Filing at the location specified for that time slot;
- I understand that any combination of three Missed Tests and/or Filing Failures committed within a twelve-month period shall constitute an anti-doping rule violation for which the sanction is a period of Ineligibility of two years with a possible reduction down to a minimum of one year according to WADA Anti-doping Code (2015):

*Article 2.4 Whereabouts Failures: Any combination of three missed tests and/or filing failures, as defined in the international Standard for Testing and investigations, within a twelve-month period by an athlete in a registered testing Pool.*

*Article 10.3.2 For violations of Article 2.4, the period of Ineligibility shall be two years, subject to reduction down to a minimum of one year, depending on the athlete's degree of fault. The flexibility between two years and one year of Ineligibility in this Article is not available to athletes where a pattern of last-minute whereabouts changes or other conduct raises a serious suspicion that the athlete was trying to avoid being available for testing.*
