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I. GENERAL INFORMATION

1. INTRODUCTION

The World Wushu Championships (WWC) is the highest level of international competition within the sport of wushu. This biennial event began in 1991 and always captures the excitement and range of wushu both in the explosive full-contact combat sanda bouts and the dynamic movements and distinct weaponry of taolu forms competition. While the number of participating athletes and member federations has grown substantially as wushu has continued to expand across the globe, the purpose of WWC has, at its core, remained the same: to be the comprehensive pinnacle of wushu competition.

The scale of the 17th World Wushu Championships (17th WWC) in Brasilia, Brazil will befit the significance of the event. From September 7 to 14, 2025, athletes from five continents are expected to compete in Brasilia as the culmination of their hard work and preparation. The Brazilian Wushu Confederation, with the support of city of Brasilia, is responsible for organizing the 17th WWC under the auspices of the IWUF. The 42nd IWUF Executive Board Meeting and 17th IWUF Congress will be held on September 8th and 9th, respectively, in conjunction with the 17th WWC.

3.2 Brazil

Brazil is the largest country in both South America and Latin America. At 8.5 million square kilometers (3.2 million square miles) and with over 208 million people, Brazil is the world's fifth-largest country by area and the sixth most populous. The capital is Brasília, and the most populated city is São Paulo. It is the largest country to have Portuguese as an official language and the only one in the America, besides being one of the most multicultural and ethnically diverse nations, due to the strong immigration from various places in the world.

Bounded by the Atlantic Ocean on the east, Brazil has a coastline of 7,491 kilometers (4,655 mi). It borders all other South American countries except Ecuador and Chile and covers 47.3% of the continent's land area. Its Amazon River basin includes a vast tropical forest, home to diverse wildlife, a variety of ecological systems, and extensive natural resources spanning numerous protected habitats. This unique environmental heritage makes Brazil one of 17 megadiverse countries, and is the subject of significant global interest and debate regarding deforestation and environmental protection.





3.3 Brasilia - Federal District

Brasilia is the federal capital and political center of Brazil and the fifth most populous urban concentration in the country. It is the only modern city worldwide to be recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Based on an architectural project designed by Lucio Costa and the world-renowned Oscar Niemeyer, the city came to life in 1960 under President Juscelino Kubitschek. Built in just 1,000 days as the new capital, its level of modernity was shocking; even today the constructions still stand as world landmarks of architecture and urbanism.



Brasilia's population, which today exceeds 3 million, is a mix of people from regions all over Brazil, as reflected in the city's dynamic and vibrant culture. Brasilia, the third richest city in Brazil, is also an important economic hub of the country. Brasilia also sets the standard for green initiatives, with the government encouraging sustainable industries like software development, film production, and gemology.



3.4 International Airport

Brasilia International Airport (Code: BSB)

This airport is conveniently located very close to downtown, from where any facilities related to the 13th PAWC can be reached in about twenty minutes by car. Arrivals and departures at this airport will be supported by the LOC in the days predicted in this regulation.

Actually, Brasilia International Airport has a few companies operating direct international flights: Copa Airlines (Panama City), Latam Chile (Santiago), Latam Paraguay (Asuncion), Latam Peru (Lima). Flights coming from other city generally have connection in São Paulo (GRU Airport).



3.5 Weather

Historical average temperatures for Brasilia in September range from 15° - 30°C

3.6 Currency

The Brazilian currency is the Real, abbreviated as BRL. The USD/BRL exchange rate is approximately \$1.00/R\$5.60.

3.7 Electricity

The Brasilia electricity standard is 220 volts/50 Hz.

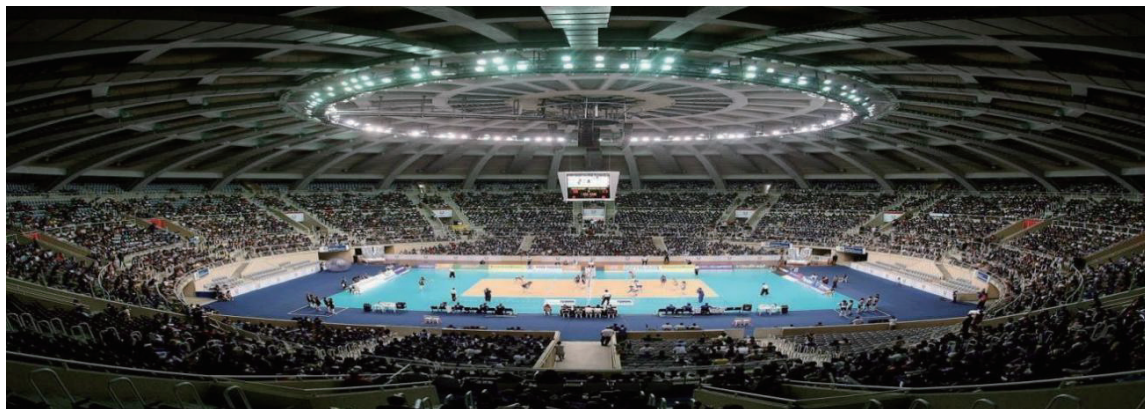
5. VENUE

7. QUALIFICATION

7.1 Membership

Only those federations/associations which have paid their IWUF annual membership fees for 2024 and 2025 will be permitted to participate in the 17th WWC.

New IWUF member federations may be invited to take part in the 17th WWC after their membership applications have been accepted by the IWUF.

7.2 Nationality

Athletes must have citizenship of the same nationality as the country/territory which they are representing.

Athletes who have dual citizenship can only represent one (1) country/territory in the championships.

7.3 Age Requirements

Taolu athletes 12 years old and older, i.e. born on and after January 1, 2013, may participate.

Sanda athletes between 18-40 years old, i.e. born between January 1, 1985, and December 31, 2007, may participate.

8. PARTICIPATION METHODS

8.1 Team Composition

Each member federation can enter at most one (1) team, hereinafter is referred to as “Team”.

Each Team can comprise of both taolu and sanda members.

Each Team shall comprise of a maximum total of twenty-four (24) members with up to twelve (12) members designated each for taolu and sanda as follows:

- One (1) Team leader
- Two (2) Team coaches
- One (1) Team doctor
- Eight (8) athletes (including men & women)

Extra team delegate(s) exceeding the quota shall be registered as observer(s).

8.2 Taolu Events

Each athlete may enter a maximum four (4) of the following taolu events

- One (1) bare- hand routine: Changquan, Nanquan, Taijiquan

- One (1) short weapon routine: Daoshu, Jianshu, Nandao, Taijijian
- One (1) long weapon routine: Gunshu, Qiangshu, Nangun

Each Team may enter at most one (1) Duilian event total.

8.3 Sanda Events

Each Team shall be composed of a maximum of eight (8) sanda athletes, with at most five (5) men and at most three (3) women athletes.

Each Team may enter at most one (1) athlete per weight category, and each athlete may enter only one (1) weight category.

9. COMPETITION RULES

Unless otherwise stated within these regulations, the competition will be conducted in accordance with the:

- IWUF Wushu Taolu Competition Rules & Judging Methods (2024)
- IWUF Wushu Sanda Competition Rules & Judging Methods (2024)

Hereinafter, competition rules for both taolu and sanda disciplines will be referred to simply as the “Rules” and “Methods” in each context.

The Rules and Methods may be interpreted solely at the discretion of the IWUF.

In the event of language discrepancies in the Rules and Methods, the English text shall prevail.

9.1 Taolu Competition

9.1.1 Preliminaries and Finals

When the number of participants in an event exceeds fifty (50) athletes, preliminaries and finals shall be conducted. Athlete can either use the same or a different routine in his or her preliminary and final competitions, the routines used shall conform to the requirements in Rules and Regulations. Preliminaries do not determine official rankings and eligible for any medals.

- Preliminaries
 - In the case when the number of participants in an event exceeds fifty (50) athletes, the athletes will be divided evenly into several groups for preliminaries.
 - The twelve (12)-top ranking athletes in the same taolu event of the 16th WWC, if registered in the 17th WWC, will be seeded alternately among the groups when preliminary round.
 - The athletes' start order of each group in preliminaries is determined by a drawing of lots.
- Finals
 - The finals consist of twelve (12) athletes. Equal numbers of top finishers from each group will qualify for the finals.
 - The athletes' start order in finals is determined by a drawing of lots that will be held one (1) day prior to the date of finals.

9.1.2 Optional Routines

The "Events with Degree of Difficulty Scoring Methods and Standards" will be implemented.

Within a single routine, an athlete may register and perform a single Degree of Difficulty Jumping Technique at most two (2) times; however, the Degree of Difficulty Connection for these jumps may not be repeated (e.g. within a single optional routine an athlete may register and perform xuanfengjiao 360° (360° Tornado Kick) at most two (2) times, but the Degree of Difficulty Connection for each Tornado Kick must be different).

In Changquan-type events, Difficulty Jump Movement: 323B, 323C, 324B, 324C and 353C must be connected to the Degree of Difficulty Connection Content as stipulated in the Rules table 10-3-7 when landing.

In Nanquan-type events, Difficulty Jump Movement: 323B, 323C, 324B and 324C must be connected to the Degree of Difficulty Connection Content as stipulated in the Rules table 10-3-8 when landing.

In Taijiquan-type events, Difficulty Jump Movement: 323B, 323C, 324B and 324C must be connected to the Degree of Difficulty Connection Content as stipulated in the Rules table 10-3-9 when landing.

All athletes are required to execute their optional routine's relevant compulsory/mandatory techniques, and failure to do so will result in deductions as stipulated in the Rules.

9.1.3 Taijiquan and Taijijian

Accompanying music is required for Taijiquan and Taijijian routines and must be uploaded through the online registration system with each Team's final entry submission. Music with vocals and/or lyrics is not permitted.

9.1.4 Duilian Routines

For Duilian (choreographed sparring) routines "Events without Degree of Difficulty Scoring Methods and Standards" will be implemented.

9.2 Sanda Competition

The competition will utilize the single-knockout method. However, if the number of athletes in a given weight class is three (3), a round-robin competition method will be adopted.

Following arrival and accreditation, sanda athletes will undergo an initial weigh-in and drawing-of-lots as stipulated in the schedule. Athletes that are competing on a specific day of competition are required to weigh-in at the specific time and place prior to the start of the day's event.

10. UNIFORM & EQUIPMENT

The following sections list uniform and equipment requirements and procedures for different locations and functions.

10.1 Competition Requirements

10.1.1 Taolu

Each athlete shall wear wushu competition uniforms that conform to the requirements as stipulated in the Rules during all events. All athletes must provide their own uniform(s).

All weaponry must conform to the requirements as stipulated in the Rules. All athletes must provide their own weaponry.

Two (2) competition bibs (20cm*15cm) for each athlete's use will be provided by the Organizing Committee to Teams upon accreditation. The athlete should show his/her competition bib to the head judge before he/she enters the competition mat.

10.1.2 Sanda

Each athlete must provide two (2) sets of competition uniforms: one (1) red set and one (1) blue set.

Each athlete must provide their own gum guard, groin cups, and hand wraps.

Gloves, headgear and chest protector manufactured by IWUF's certified supplier(s) will be provided by the Organizing Committee.

10.2 Compliance Requirement of Marketing and Advertising

All Teams must follow the IWUF Brand Control Guidelines for Wushu Competition Uniforms (excerpt) (see **Annex 1**).

10.3 Clothing Requirements for Opening/Closing Ceremonies

All Teams must wear their official national /territorial team uniforms at the Opening and Closing Ceremonies.

10.4 Clothing Requirements for Award Ceremony

Medalists are expected to attend the Award Ceremony in their national/territorial team uniforms; however, they are permitted to attend the ceremony wearing competition uniforms should the ceremony take place immediately after the competition.

Athletes are expected to take off caps/hats/sun glass during the ceremony.

Athletes are required to face the flags while they are being raised.

Athletes are not allowed to take any other national, cultural or religious symbols to or onto the podium.

10.5 Compliance Check at Roll Call Center

Uniform and weapons checks will be conducted at the Roll Call Center in accordance with stated regulations and requirements. Uniforms and weapons checks are conducted by the Chief Register and the Roll-Call Officials as stipulated in the Rules. Non-compliance may be subject to disqualification from the competition.

All athletes are required to attend the initial roll call thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of their competition event, and be present for all subsequent roll calls. Failure to be present for three (3) roll calls will result in forfeit.

11. PLACING & AWARDS

11.1 Placing & Awards

11.2 Award Ceremony

Athletes having won a medal are required to attend the Award Ceremony to receive their medals in person. In case a medalist is unable to attend the ceremony for a valid reason, his/her medal may be presented to an official of the relevant delegation. Absence without a valid reason will forfeit the right to receive a medal.

Team leaders, coaches, doctors, observers, and members must stay at the designated area and are prohibited from entering the awarding platform area and/or interrupting the Award Ceremony.

If fewer than three (3) athletes participate in a given event, no Award Ceremony will be held for that event, however, athletes will still be ranked and receive awards accordingly.

11.3 Participation Certificates

All members of each Team, including team leaders, coaches, doctors, and athletes will receive a 17th WWC participation certificate.

The Team leader is required to collect the participation certificates, as well as certificates of taolu athletes placing 4th-8th (if applicable), for their Team from the Organizing Committee at the designated Results & Certificate Center.

12. REGISTRATION

12.1 Preliminary Entry

Preliminary Entry must be submitted through the IWUF designated Online Registration System.

Online Preliminary Entry will be open from May 7, 2025, 24:00 (Brasilia Standard Time) and closed on **June 7, 2025, 24:00** (Brasilia Standard Time).

Participating teams must state the number of athletes and team officials as accurately as possible taking part in the events so that the LOC may reserve the hotel and prepare the organization of the event accordingly. There is no guarantee for hotel rooms reservation for teams failed to submit their Preliminary Entry before the required deadline.

All teams are required to complete their Online Preliminary Entry before the deadline to access the Final Entry System.

12.2 Final Entry

Final Entry must be submitted through the IWUF Online Registration System.

Online Final Entry will be open from June 8, 2025, 24:00 (Brasilia Standard Time) and closed on **July 21, 2025, 24:00** (Brasilia Standard Time). Each Team is required to print a copy of the submitted entry and present it during accreditation upon arrival in Brasilia.

All sections of the online entry must be completed in full, including registration of athletes' Degree of Difficulty Techniques in the relevant online section.

*All payments due to the LOC must be paid in full for registration to be considered complete.

12.3 Late Registration and Changes Policy

Member Associations with requests for late registration or changes must submit a written document for approval and shall pay corresponding fees before the late registration deadline, otherwise request will be denied.

The deadline for late registration and changes is due on **August 21, 2025, 24:00** (Brasilia Standard Time).

Late entries or information change (athlete replacement, changes due to incorrect or missing registration information) are subject to the approval of the IWUF and, if accepted, are subject to a late-entry fee of US\$ 100 per athlete per event.

The above fees must be paid via wire transfer to the IWUF Secretariat before **August 21, 2025, 24:00** (Brasilia Standard Time).

13. ARRIVAL & ACCREDITATION

13.1 Arrival

All Teams are required to register with the 17th WWC Organizing Committee at the designated Accreditation Center no later than 24:00 (Brasilia Standard Time) on **September 8, 2025**.

All judges are required to register with the 17th WWC Organizing Committee at the designated Accreditation Center no later than 24:00 (Brasilia Standard Time) on **September 7, 2025**.

Hotel check-in is after 15:00 (Brasilia Standard Time), and accommodations should be booked accordingly (e.g. Teams wishing check in on September 7 before 15:00 must have booked their accommodations beginning on September 6).

13.2. Accreditation

Accreditation Center(s) will open at 09:00 on **September 7, 2025**.

Upon arrival at the Accreditation Center, the Team leader is required to complete the following process with the Organizing Committee:

1	Present each team member's passport
2	Submit a paper copy of a signed and stamped Final Entry Form and confirm the registration information
3	Submit three (3) national flags (size: 1m*2m)
4	Submit national anthem (short version) in MP3 format on a CD or USB flash drive
5	Submit valid Medical Certificates (Annex 2)
6	Submit valid life and liability insurance certificates
7	Submit the signed Wavier of Liabilities (Annex 3)
8	Confirm each athlete's Registration Form for Degree of Difficulty Techniques of Optional Routines and sign the form
9	Pay the relevant participation fees in full (if applicable)
10	Pay the relevant penalty fees in full (if applicable)
11	Sign and confirm all the above items are completed

Accreditation cards will be given to the team leader upon completion of the accreditation process. Accreditation cards must be worn during all official 17th WWC events.

The training schedule will be announced after accreditation has concluded.

14. TECHNICAL MEETING

The Technical Meeting will take place at 14:00 on **September 9, 2025**. Each Team should send 1-3 representatives to attend the meeting.

The Technical Meeting content will be presented as follows:

- IWUF Event Guidelines (IWUF representatives)
- Event Logistics Information (Organizing Committee representatives)

- Event Technical Details (Chair of Jury of Appeals/Chief Referee)
- Other matters

15. DRAWING OF LOTS

After technical meeting, the Drawing of Lots will be conducted by the scheduler-recorder group supervised by the Jury of appeals and the Chief Referee on **September 9, 2025**. The Drawing of Lots for taolu and sanda disciplines will be held simultaneously in two separate rooms. Each Team should send one to two (1-2) representatives for each discipline to attend the sessions.

The Jury of Appeals will draw lots on behalf of Teams if the Team representatives are absent from the session.

16. WEIGH-IN

The first official weigh-in for all sanda athletes will take place at 07:00 on **September 9, 2025**. Furthermore, sanda athletes must attend a weigh-in on each day they participate in competition (specific time and places for each weigh-in will be announced accordingly). Accreditation cards and passports must be presented at each weigh-in session. A sanda athlete's failure to attend any required weigh-in will result in his/her disqualification from the competition.

17. TECHNICAL OFFICIALS & JURY OF APPEALS

17.1 Judges (Referees)

17.1.1 Appointment of Judges

Each Team may submit at most one (1) taolu judge and one (1) sanda judge to officiate at the 17th WWC subject to approval of IWUF. All judges of the 17th WWC must hold a valid IWUF International Judge License at the time of competition.

The IWUF will appoint independent judges at its discretion to serve at the 17th WWC.

All International Judges must input their valid IWUF certificate numbers through the online registration system when registering and present their original certificates to the IWUF Judges' Committee upon arrival and registration in Brasilia.

17.1.2 Registration

Information for judges selected by teams must be submitted at the time of team registration.

17.1.3 Judges' Refresher Course

All 17th WWC judges are required to participate in the Judges' Refresher Course. The purpose of this course is to ensure that judges have a solid understanding and grasp of competition rules, and to enhance transparency, objectivity and quality in judging.

17.1.4 Judges' Uniform Requirements

All judges shall prepare their own black jackets, white dress shirts, black slacks, and black leather shoes.

17.2 Jury of Appeals and Appeals Procedures

The Jury of Appeals and appeals procedures shall be subject to the relevant provisions of IWUF Wushu Taolu Competition Rules & Judging Methods (2024) and IWUF Wushu Sanda Competition Rules & Judging Methods (2024).

18. SUPERVISORY COMMISSION

A 17th WWC Supervisory Commission shall be established by the IWUF, with the purpose of and the right to resolve any disputes or investigate any issues that arise during the course of the 17th WWC to ensure the smooth execution of the event.

The Supervisory Commission for an IWUF World Championships consists of three to five (3-5) members appointed by the President of the IWUF and is responsible for overseeing Championships management and dispute mediation for the entire duration of the Championships and not beyond. Specific descriptions of responsibilities include:

- The Commission will ensure that Championships adhere to principles of fair play, impartiality, and transparency.
- The Commission represents the IWUF in handling disputes regarding the Championships that arise between National Federations (NFs) and/or teams and/or the LOC, and has the right to resolve such disputes. However, the Commission does not directly interfere with the competition proceedings or disputes arise within the competition, which are responsibility of Jury of Appeal and relevant judging panel.
- The Commission represents the IWUF in coordinating between NFs and/or teams and/or the LOC.

- The Commission shall report any irregularities or violations observed during the Championships to the IWUF President and the IWUF Executive Board.
- The Commission shall monitor and demand that NFs take responsibility for their athletes' general attitude and comportment.

III. TEAM INFORMATION

19. ACCOMMODATION

19.1 Accommodation Reservation

All Teams are required to lodge at the designated hotels as arranged by the Organizing Committee.

Teams unable to stay in the designated hotel due to special reasons shall pay a participation fee of USD 200 per person. In this case, it shall be responsibility of the Team for their accommodation, transportation, meals as well as consequences arising as a result of this.

The Organizing Committee will arrange accommodation and local transportation for all Teams from September 7-15, 2025. Teams who would like to arrive earlier or depart later than the required dates should provide the dates for the intended duration of stay during the final registration process. Teams must ensure to book accommodations accordingly, with daily rates applying for extended stays and taking the hotel check-in time of 15:00 into consideration.

19.2 Room Reservation Policy

Teams with odd number of delegates including athletes, observers, team judges and/or extra officials when having reserved double rooms, the extra single delegate will be allocated by the Organizing Committee in double rooms with other team member, if the individual chooses not to pay for the price of a single room.

The Organizing Committee will allocate the hotels for Teams based on the order they submit their final entry.

19.3 Hotel Information

Hotel information will be distributed immediately when available.

20. TRANSPORTATION

Transportation for arrival and departure at Brasilia International Airport will be arranged for all registered team delegates or technical officials on September 7 or 8, 2025, respectively.

Local transportation between official hotels and venues will be provided by shuttle buses. A detailed transportation schedule will be provided upon arrival.

21. FINANCIAL INFORMATION

21.1 Rates (per person per day)

The standard participation fee includes catering, accommodation, local transportation (airport pick-up and drop-off and transportation between hotel and venue). All Teams shall pay their participation fee in full to the 17th WWC Organizing Committee via wire transfer upon final registration.

Exact rate information will be distributed immediately when available.

21.2 Payment Methods

All Teams are required to complete payment in advance to the Organizing Committee by 24:00 (Brasilia Standard Time) **July 21, 2025** through international remittance.

Teams that are unable to pay through international remittance should communicate with the Organizing Committee in advance to make arrangements; otherwise, accreditation will not be issued.

21.3 Bank Information of Organizing Committee:

The information will be available later and updated to the teams.

22. PASSPORTS & VISA REQUIREMENTS

All 17th WWC participants must hold a valid passport and should allow plenty of time for visa application and processing. To ensure as few complications during visa application and travel as possible, it is suggested that all participants' passports are valid for at least six months following their final day of travel.

Teams that require visa invitation letters should state their requests in the Online Preliminary Entry by 24:00 (Brasilia Standard Time) **June 7, 2025**.

23. DOPING CONTROL

Doping control will be conducted during the 17th WWC in accordance with the requirements of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), and Brazilian Anti-Doping Association (BADA) will follow the procedure prescribed in the last IWUF Anti-Doping Rules.

The Organizing Committee shall contract with NADOs to execute testing activities on request by ITA.

24. RESPONSIBILITY OF MEMBER FEDERATIONS

NFs are responsible for their officials, coaches, athletes, and observers adhering to the IWUF and WWC principles and to all relevant rules established by the IWUF and Organizing Committee. NFs should ensure that their participants hold themselves to the highest standards in all their actions during the event.

24.1 Fundamental Principles

All NFs' Team members participating in the 17th WWC must observe and respect the IWUF constitution, rules, regulations, and representatives. Individuals deemed to have acted against the IWUF, its principles, interests or purpose may be subject to suspension or expulsion from the event and/or cancellation of their accreditation. Those who cannot participate in the activities and competitions on time due to their own reasons shall accept responsibility for consequences arising as a result of this.

24.2 Attitude of Athletes and Coaches

The athletes will compete under the responsibility of their NFs. NFs are fully responsible regarding the general attitude and comportment of their athletes. Coaches should respect the judging panel and all complaints must be conducted in accordance with competition procedures. Athletes and Coaches should comply with the IWUF Code of Ethics. Any act against the IWUF judging panel may be subject to suspension or expulsion from the event and/or cancellation of their accreditation and/or competition results.

24.3 Image of Athletes

Each NF is responsible for obtaining the rights for the IWUF to use its athletes' images at the discretion of the IWUF for promotional purposes in all forms.

24.4 Insurance

Each NF is fully and sole responsible for insuring its athletes against injury and third-party risk (public liability) during the period of the 17th WWC. The IWUF and the Organizing Committee are not responsible in part or in whole of the said liability.

Brand Control Guidelines for Wushu Competition Uniforms (excerpt)****Purpose**

To ensure sponsor and manufacture rights by establishing a standard for brand placement on uniforms and other clothing items used during IWUF wushu competition.

Standards and Guidelines

Uniforms of athletes, coaches and team officials

General requirements

The manufacturer logo may appear once on each piece of clothing, with an area of up to 20 cm². Note that only the quantity and size of logos appearing on uniforms will be assessed during the competition, and logos will not be reviewed for accuracy or adherence to brand standards.

The manufacturer logo may appear once on each accessory item (paired accessories are considered as two items), with an area of up to 6cm².

A manufacturer logo may appear once on each shoe or foot item (paired shoes or foot items are considered as two items), with an area of up to 6 cm².

A national/regional Olympic Committee flag, a national/regional wushu federation flag/logo may each appear once where specified, with an area of up to 20 cm² each.

Wushu taolu competition uniform requirements

Top/jacket

Front

No advertisements or logos may appear on the collar.

A flag may appear on the left chest area, with an area of up to 20 cm².

The manufacturer logo may appear on the right chest area, with an area of up to 20 cm².

No advertisements may appear in other areas.

Back

Sponsor or other logos may be displayed in other areas. The total number of sponsor or other logos may not exceed three (3), with a maximum area of 20 cm² each.

Pants/trousers

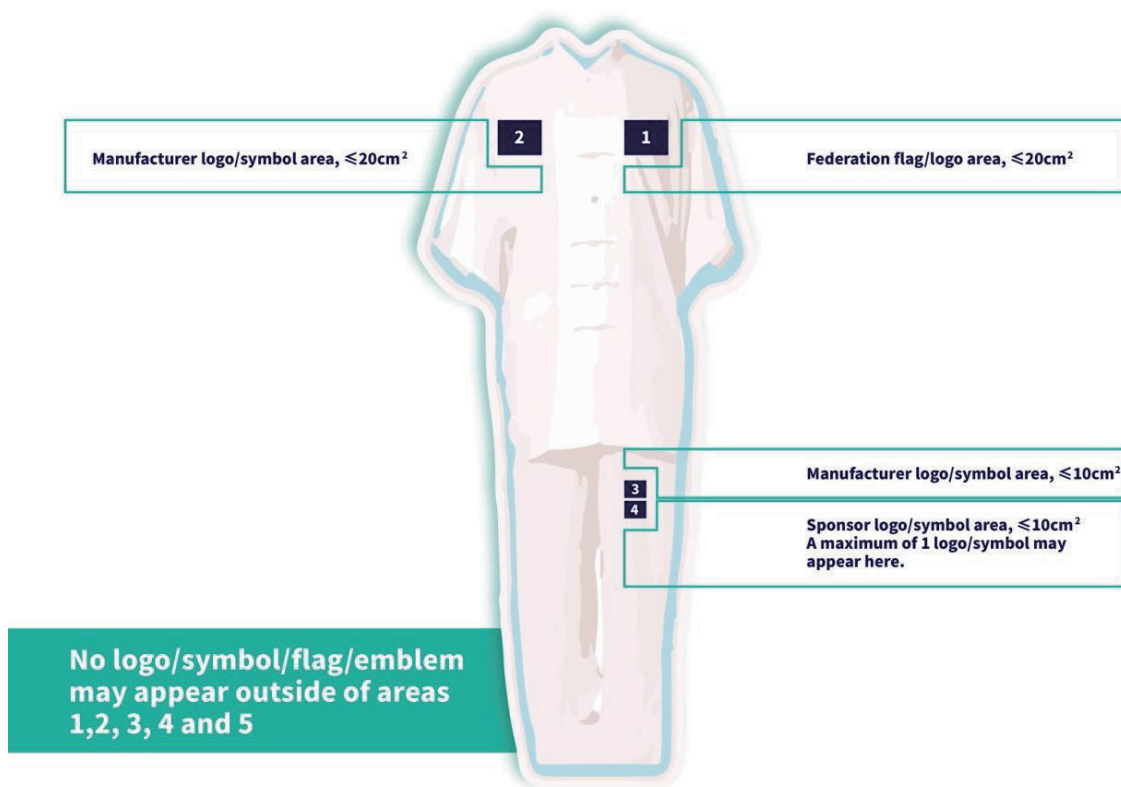

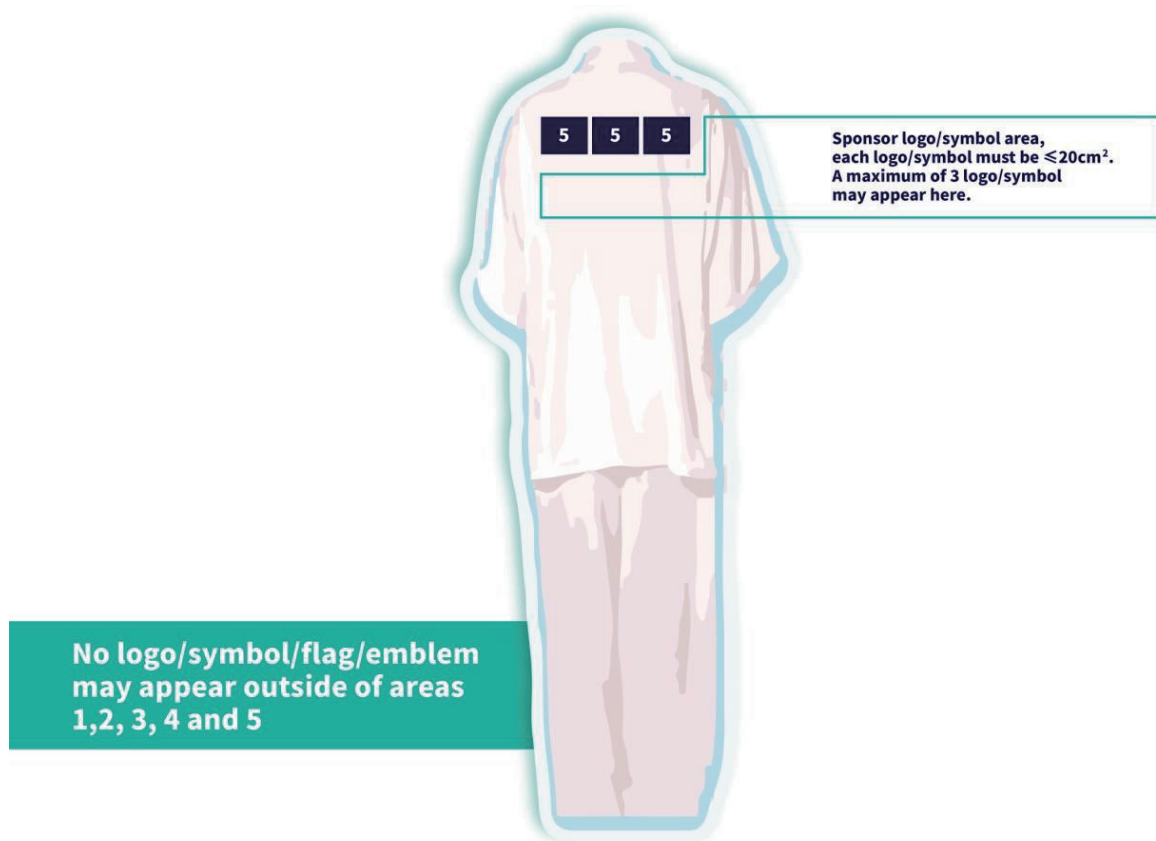
The manufacturer logo may be arranged on the top, with an area of up to 10 cm².

Sponsor logos may appear below the manufacturer's logo but may not appear within 5 cm of the manufacturer's logo, with an area of up to 10 cm².

Right leg

No logo, flag, or other emblem may appear.

Top/shirt

Front

A flag may appear on the left chest area, with an area of up to 20 cm^2 .

The manufacturer logo may appear on the right chest area, with an area of up to 20 cm^2 .

Sponsor or other logos may be displayed in other areas but may not appear within 5cm of the flag or manufacturer logo. The total number of sponsor or other logos may not exceed one (1), with a maximum area of 20 cm^2 .

Back

Sponsor or other logos may be displayed in back areas. The total number of sponsor or other logos may not exceed three (3), with a maximum area of 20 cm^2 .

Shorts

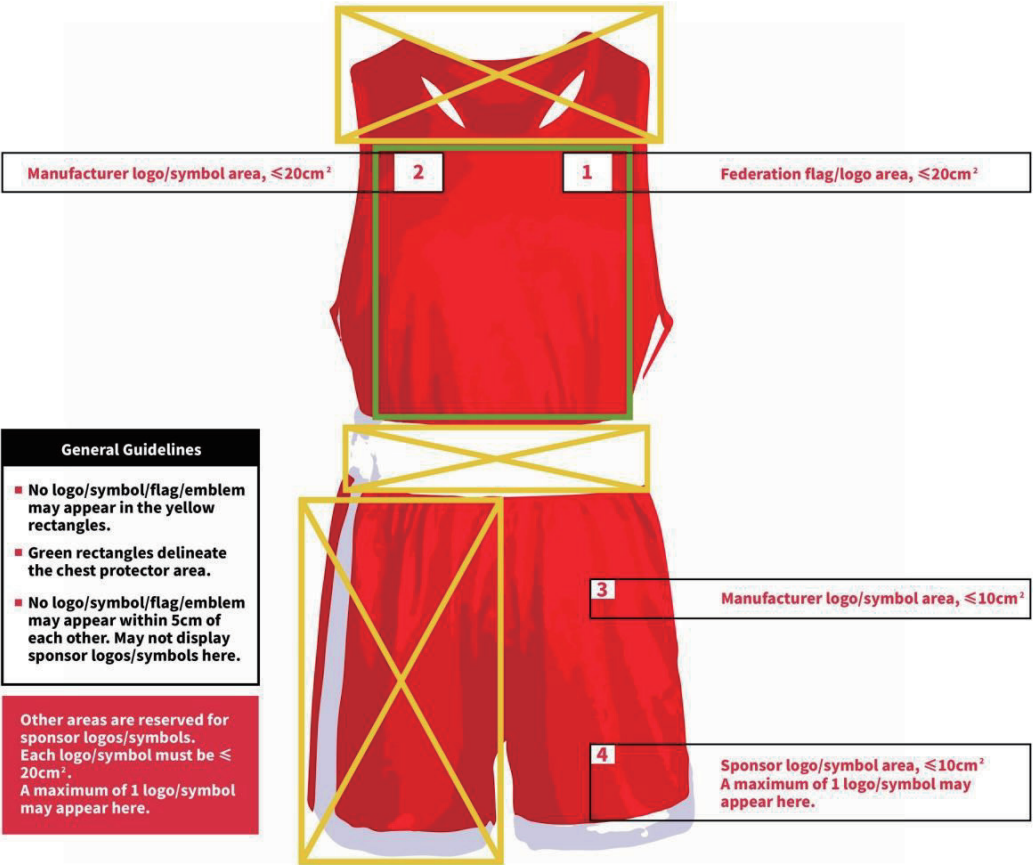
Left leg

The manufacturer logo may be arranged on the top, with an area of up to 10 cm^2 .

Sponsor logos may appear below the manufacturer's logo but may not appear within 5 cm of the manufacturer's logo. The total number of sponsor or other logos may not exceed one (1), with an area of up to 10 cm².

Right leg

No logo, flag, or other emblem may appear.





Award Ceremony

Besides general requirements outlined in event guidelines, athletes are not allowed to wear jumpsuits, gloves, hats, goggles, sunglasses, or other accessories when participating in the award Ceremony.
